

Action plan for reflecting and enhancing Student Engagement practices at your Higher Education Institution

These two activities work together as an exercise to reflect where your Higher Education Institution currently stands in regards to four areas of Student Engagement and/or Students as Partners practice, and plan to create an action plan for the future. This activity can be conducted alone but is most powerful conducted as a group where you can collectively reflect, discuss and plan as a team of students, academic and professional staff.

Stage 1: Reflecting on current practice

Prompt: Example student engagement practices at HEIs in these areas include:

Student Representation: Course level Student Academic Representatives; Students' Union/Association Elected Officers; Faculty/School Representatives; Halls Representatives.

Student Feedback / Consultation: Surveys; module/unit evaluation forms; feedback forums; Pop-up Feedback Events.

Student Empowerment: Student Fellows (The University of Winchester); Change Agents (The University of Exeter);

Student Responsibility: Peer Assisted Learning (The University of Manchester); Success Coaches (London Metropolitan University); Students as Recruiters (The University of Lincoln).

Stage 2: Planning Ahead

Following the above exercise and your conversation, your team may be in a position to action plan certain themes or activities which have emerged in the above conversations. The below action plan grid has example timeframes which can be changed for your context's current timeframes.
